IT WAS a busman's holiday in Gwelo today for Lt-Gen. Peter Walls, the Commander of Combined Operations, who took the day off from his military duties to attend a passing-out ceremony at the School of Infantry.

The cadets at the ceremony were addressed by the commandant of the school, Lt.-Col. E. M. Sobey, who told them that the achievement of a settlement was in the hands of the politicians.
